

# Poster Project

**TASK:** Create a poster based on one of the books that you have read this term. The poster should resemble a movie poster. You should use A3 paper. You can use color or white paper, and colored pens and pencils.

The poster should include

- the title of the book (correctly capitalized)
- the author
- the names of the main characters
- the publisher
- your rating
- pictures or collages showing characters or interesting parts of the story
  - The poster and picture should NOT be based on the front cover of the book.
- written summary of the story (30 to 50 words)
- good points and bad points of the story
- why someone might enjoy the book

**DUE DATE:** Posters and Presentations are due Monday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. Be sure that you are ready!

**GRADING:** Your grade for this project is based on your poster (50 pts) and your presentation (50pts). The design of your poster will be worth 20 points, while the written part is worth 30 points. It is important that you proofread your work before you turn the final product in. The written part of your poster will be graded based on the following scale:

- 30 pts - Error free
- 25 pts - 1 to 2 minor errors (grammar, spelling, usage, sentence structure)
- 20 pts - 3 to 5 errors
- 10 pts - 5 to 9 errors
- 5 pts - 10 or more errors

**Giving your Presentation**

- Speak slowly and clearly.
- Don't just read (you can use notes, but not the whole document).
- Look up and make eye contact.
- Use transitions signals to separate your points.
- Give good reasons for your opinions (don't just say you liked the passage because it was easy).

Please make sure to

- proof read your poster!
- Use the planning page. Turn it in with the project.
- Include your name on the front of the poster.
- Make your poster interesting.
- Present your poster to the class.
